FAQs for Residence Admission Scheme (RAS)

1. Q: What is the Residence Admission Scheme?

A: The Residence Admission Scheme (RAS) is a housing scheme for **senior undergraduate students** who wish to apply for Halls, Houses and Student Residences.

The intent of the scheme is to enhance student life on campus by providing access to campus housing for student leaders and members of active student groups, removing the barrier of time and energy that is spent on traveling to and from campus. In this way, the scheme aims to aid in student leaders' planning and facilitation of student life programmes and enhance participation amongst active members of these student groups.

2. Q: Who will RAS be applicable to?

A: The scheme is applicable to full-time local and international <u>senior</u> undergraduate students. The scheme is <u>not applicable</u> to incoming Year 1 undergraduate students (local and international), as well as students applying for housing at Residential Colleges.

3. Q: Is my student group able to participate in RAS?

A: Eligible participants of RAS are **NUS Students' Union (NUSSU)** and its Constituent Clubs, CFA groups and hostel-based groups in Halls, Houses and Residences. Official and active Societies and Interest Groups registered with OSA (including Sports Interest Groups) are also eligible for this scheme, contingent on meeting the application criteria and submitting the relevant documents by the stipulated deadline that is found in RAS Terms and Conditions. The list of 'Participating RAS Groups' can be found at The Office of Student Affairs' website under Hostel Admissions.

4. Q: What are the features of RAS?

A: RAS has five categories. Each category comprises a few sub-categories for which priority for accommodation is provided. Further details on RAS can be found at The Office of Student Affairs' website under Hostel Admissions.

5. Q: How do I apply for housing under RAS?

A:

- (i) Senior Undergraduates nominated under Categories A and D should submit their housing applications for Residences during the first Senior Undergraduate hostel admission exercise in March and November respectively.
- (ii) Senior Undergraduates nominated under Categories B and C (not via Master's List) should submit their housing applications during the Senior Undergraduate housing admission exercise in March annually.
- (iii) Senior Undergraduates nominated under Category C (via Master's List) should submit their housing applications during the Senior Undergraduate housing admission exercise in March and November annually. Their applications would then be prioritized based on the RAS framework.

6. Q: Why are the members from management committees of NUSSU, constituent clubs, societies and interest groups given priority places under RAS?

A: The University acknowledges that student leaders of these groups spend a significant amount of time in the planning and facilitating of student life activities on campus, and having quick access to campus is beneficial in ensuring student activities are carried out smoothly. Hence, these student leaders are given higher consideration for housing under RAS.

7. Q: I am a current management committee member of Club XYZ. Will I be given student housing under Category A?

A: Under Category A, a maximum of <u>10 current members</u> of the NUSSU Executive Committee and a maximum of <u>90 students</u> from the Constituent Clubs' Management Committee will be given special consideration when they

apply within the first application window. Students should be nominated by the NUSSU Executive/ Management Committee.

For registered societies and interest groups, a maximum of <u>2 current members</u> of the student group's management committee can be nominated for campus housing. If the number of nominations exceeds the subcategory's cap of 85 places, a ballot will be conducted. In such a scenario, if the number of student groups that applied and are eligible for RAS is under 85, one student per group will be offered a spot while the remaining spots will be assigned by ballot. If more than 85 student groups have applied and are eligible, a ballot will be conducted for all nominated students. Students nominated should be based on each individual student group's unique Internal Recognition and Recommendation Scheme (IRRS), which should be created and submitted by the student group representative during the eligibility application period.

Current members of the Halls' JCRCs will be provided with housing under Category C.

8. Q: I recently resigned from the management committee of Faculty Club ABC. Am I eligible to be considered for Category A?

A: To be eligible for Category A, a student must be a **current member** of the Executive/Management Committee.

9. Q: Why are management committees of Societies and Interest Groups treated differently from NUSSU and the Constituent Clubs?

A: NUSSU and the Constituent Clubs serve the whole NUS undergraduate student population with a broad and extensive membership base, involving a high volume, scope and intensity of student life activities and events on campus and a significantly larger management committee. As such, more provisions are made for the management committees of NUSSU and the Constituent Clubs.

10. Q: I am a varsity athlete who is interested in joining the Varsity Scheme. Who can I approach for more information on this scheme?

11. Q: Under Category C, what is the Master's List?

A: Each of the Halls, Houses and Student Residences has a Master's List that is managed by the respective hostel. It is primarily used to admit students who can contribute to student life and vibrancy at the hostel, and they are admitted at the discretion of the Master. **Hostel offers via Master's List are for one semester only.** If the student wishes to stay in the subsequent semester, the student has to submit another hostel application and indicate his/her interest to be part of Master's List to the respective hostels.

12. Q: I am a current resident of a Hall or House. Am I eligible for Category C?

A: Under Category C, students who have stayed in a Hall or House in the current Academic Year are eligible for consideration in the Hall/House's residents' list, in accordance with the respective Hall's Recognition System or House's selection criteria. **Students who are interested in returning to their Halls or Houses are required to indicate their current 'Hall' or 'House' as their first choice in their housing application.**

13. Q: I am currently not a member in any student groups or staying at Hall, House or Student Residence? Can I apply to stay at Hall, House or Student Residence?

A: Under Category C, a student who is not a resident of Hall, House or Student Residence may apply to join the Hall, House or Student Residence through the Master's List. You may enquire directly with the respective Hall, House or Student Residence that you are interested to join.

Non-members of student groups or students not staying at Halls, Houses and Student Residences may apply for housing under Category E. They will be randomly balloted for remaining vacancies.

14. Q: I am a member of Interest Group XTP. How can I qualify for student housing?

A: Members of NUSSU, Constituent Clubs, Societies and Interest Groups can be selected for housing under Category D.

Under Category D, <u>120 hostel places</u> are reserved for members of NUSSU and the Constituent Clubs under their respective sub-category via an internal scheme that is managed by NUSSU and the clubs.

Societies and interest groups may nominate up to 5 names for housing under their respective sub-category. If the number of nominations exceed the sub-category cap of 130 places, the number of students allocated per group will be determined such that each student group that applies and is eligible will have the same number of students who are granted a place, with the remaining places assigned based on a random ballot.

For example:

No. of student groups that applied and are eligible	Allocation per group (120 places divided by no. of student groups)	Number of places assigned via random ballot
45	130 places / 45 grps = 2 students assigned	40
	per org with 40 places leftover	
60	130 places / 60 grps = 2 students assigned	10
	per org with 10 places leftover	

Members should be nominated based on each individual student group's unique Internal Recognition and Recommendation Scheme (IRRS), which should be created and submitted by the student group representative during the eligibility application period.

15. Q: Under Categories A and D, how will housing be allocated to the different Societies and Interest groups? Will the larger groups be given more places?

A: The number of places allocated is the same regardless of the size of the student group. Each sub-category has a quota. For example, Societies & Interest Groups Management Committee has a quota of 85 places. If the number of nominations exceeds the quota, a ballot will be conducted. Please refer to questions 7 and 14 for more details about allocation.

While membership size is often the default determining factor, we understand that the diversity of student groups on campus also reflects the diversity in programmes and activities offered. Membership numbers are not always the best indicator of the level of activity and involvement of members and the impact of a student group on student life on campus.

Members who are not nominated by their management committee under Category A & D can apply for hostels under Category E.

16. Q: I am unable to participate in CCAs due to my health condition or because I have been away from the university for the entire semester or academic year. How do I apply for housing?

A: Students who have not participated in CCAs in the last semester or academic year may apply for housing under Category E. If they are unsuccessful for housing, they may submit an appeal to OSA Hostel Admission with the relevant documents supporting their appeals at the hostel application portal during the official appeal application period. More information on hostel appeal can be found in Application Portal - NUS OSA.

17. Q: How will the scheme ensure responsibility and accountability?

A: The Executive or Management Committee of a student group is accountable for its endorsement of the members. They are entrusted to ensure that the recommendation or selection process is transparent and open, and that these members are deserving of the recommendation through their contributions to the student group and its activities. The student groups are to make available to their members a copy of their Internal Recognition and Recommendation Scheme (IRRS), reviewed and approved by their Staff Advisor, before nominations are submitted. The names of the selected/recommended members should also be shared publicly with all members upon finalization for transparency.

18. Q: How can I send my queries on RAS?

A: You can send your queries respectively to:

- NUSSU (NUSSU & Constituent Clubs)
- OSA Student Leadership and Development (Registered Societies & Interest Groups)
- OSA Sports (Sports-related Interest Groups)
- OSA CFA (Art groups)
- Respective Hostels (respective Hostel staff)

19. Q: I am a current undergraduate hostelite. How do I qualify for housing in the next Academic Year?

A: Students who wish to stay in Halls, Houses or Student Residences can apply via the categories provided in RAS framework.

20. Q: Is RAS applicable only to those wishing to stay in Halls, Houses or Student Residences? How about students who wish to stay in Residential Colleges?

A: RAS for hostel-based groups are limited to Halls, Houses and Student Residences. RAS is not applicable to the Residential Colleges (RCs) as the RCs have a different set of entry criteria where students will be required to read academic modules when admitted to the college programme. However, students who have withdrawn from the RCs may subsequently apply for Halls, Houses or Student Residences under the categories provided in RAS.

21. Q: With the scheme, how many activities do I need to participate in to be assured of housing?

A: With RAS, effective contribution is considered. Hence, the number of CCAs may not be critical. The Executive/Management Committee of a student group is expected to recommend their ordinary members based on their effective contributions to the student group or activities.

22.Q: I was nominated for housing by my student group but I missed the application exercise. Can I still be allocated accommodation?

A: Students who have missed the first application exercise or failed to complete the necessary application steps for first application exercise will not be given special consideration for their hostel application even though they were nominated by their student group.

23. Q: What will happen to vacancies arising from cancellations or withdrawals etc.?

A: Vacancies arising from cancellations or withdrawals before the start of the semester will be re-allocated to Category E, general student population and appeals.

24. Q: Will RAS be applicable to students who wish to apply for Semester 1 stay for AY25/26?

A: RAS is administered for the semester ahead. In this current semester, applications are for following semester stay. Eligible student groups can submit their nomination lists for Categories A & D to OSA Student Leadership and Development by the stipulated deadline announced to eligible student groups for each semester.

25.Q: I am a current Executive Committee member of NUSSU. Will I be able to use the unutilised places under Category A to nominate ordinary members for Category D, and vice versa?

A: Any unutilised places in Category A (Executive/Management Committees) from a group may be reallocated to other NUSSU Executive/Management Committee/Sub-committee. If there are no further nominations or recommendations, the unutilised places may be re-allocated to members of the NUSSU Committee/Constituent Clubs/Sub-committee in Category D, and vice versa.

26.Q: I am a current management committee member of Society XKJ. Will I be able to use the unutilised places under Category A to nominate ordinary members for Category D, and vice versa?

A: Any unutilised places from participating Societies and Interest Groups in Category A (Executive/ Management Committees) may be re-allocated to members in Category D (Members of Student groups), and vice versa.

27.Q: Can a student who is offered a hostel stay lose his/her housing eligibility due to disciplinary issues?

A: Any student, including those under RAS, who commits housing infractions and receives sanctions that make them ineligible for housing (e.g. accumulating more than 15 demerit points across 2 semesters) will have their housing rescinded.

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
